

PROGRAM

Our speaker was Marc Shkolnick,

Manager Energy Service LES

Why Energy Efficiency? Reduce costs and everyone wins. Marc talked about leveraging technology to do the same or more with less. By conserving energy, we can delay building new power plants which are very expensive. He explained

how the need for electricity is sized to that peak day which usually occurs in mid August. Last year the peak day was Aug. 13. The peak time was between 5 and 6 o'clock when everyone is getting home from work. By changing behaviors we can reduce the amount of energy used. One example would be to do laundry at a time other than peak hours. A very small % of energy is generated by wind. Nebraksa's energy costs are very low compared to the rest of the country largely due to the use of coal and public power. Another reason is that LES has a very good rating which gives them the opportunity to get a very competitive cost of capital when issuing EPA requirements will have an impact on prices in Nebraska. We are unsure of what those requirements will be

at this time. Natural Gas is a likely al-

ternative. Visit LES website after Feb. 1 for incentives to make your home more energy efficient. You may receive 50% of project cost up to \$1000 per home for insulation. You may also receive money back for installing energy efficient heating and air. He shared with us a Top 10 list to do our

part in saving energy:

- 1 Service heating & cooling yearly
- 2- Seal air leaks in windows and doors
- 3- Add insulation
- 4- Replace old windows and doors with more efficient windows/doors
- 5- Install programable thermostat and make sure they are working properly
- 6- Evaluate lighting
- 7- Decrease hot water usage
- 8- Efficient washer/dryer
