Carol Horner with the Council Bluffs Rotary was gracious enough to fill in for our speaker who was unable to make it to the meeting. Carol told the members about her club in Council Bluffs which marks its centennial year this year as it was formed in April 1915. It is amazing to think that a club can have such an impact on a community for so long! The club was sponsored by the Downtown Lincoln Club 14 and currently has about 100 members. 60% of the members are female and 65% are less than 50 years old.



Carol told the club about some of the projects her club is doing which includes raising funds to revitalize Fairmont park in Council Bluffs which has been a staple in the community for many years. They are hoping to have a celebration in the fall to celebrate the renovations.

Council Bluffs has 3 fundraisers each year which include a chili luncheon in late February and a soup luncheon in October. Both are held at the Masonic Temple in Council Bluffs. Members bring the soups and these 2 events draw 350 to 450 people. The Last fundraiser is a Texas Holdem' tournament held in February at the Council Bluffs Elks Club.

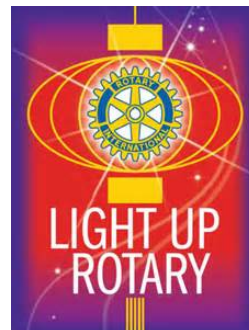
They also do a Souper Bowl Food Drive each year and raise \$3,000 in cash and \$5,000 in food donations.

Internationally they participate in a Zambia Water for People Project at the District Level. One of their projects with District Designated Funds was the production of a video & website on shaken baby syndrome.

They also give four \$1,500 scholarships to students every year.
