

## PROGRAM

Our speaker for the day was Jay Sturdevant who is an archeologist with

the Midwest Archeological Center (the "Center").

The Center was started in the late 40's as a Smithsonian office which was opened to assist with the river basin surveys for the dams built on the Missouri river. Since the dams flooded large areas, the center did



excavations of the sites for archeological remains before the dams were built. After that project was done, the operations of the Center were transferred to the National Park Services with the goals changing to that of preserving the National Parks in the Midwest region.

The Center serves 13 states from Ohio to the Great Lakes, to North Dakota, Kansas, Arkansas and Missouri. All of the national Parks have 100's of archeological sites that need to be preserved and maintained. The Center has 10-12 permanent archeologists on staff as well as a number of support staff and volunteer students who help in the lab. The Center has a good relationship with UNL and uses a lot of archeology students for its projects. The Center works on a wide range of projects from investigating war crimes

and genocide in Rwanda to re creating the details of the Battle of the Little Big Horn. They were able to add details the story of the battle by looking at archeological remains and determining where shots were fired and where the victims fell.

National Parks in Nebraska include Homestead

National Monument in Beatrice, Niobrara, Agate Falls, Scottsbluff National Monument and a Missouri River section. There are different levels of National Parks including Parks, Monuments, Historical Sites, Military Parks, Scenic River ways and Scenic Trails.

There are a finite amount of archeological resources and it is always a difficult decision as to whether they should be preserved in their original state for future study or excavated for reconstruction off site.

Jay mentioned that he is teaching a class at SCC from March 29th through April 12th titled "America's Best Idea– Get to Know your National Parks." If anyone is interested, contact SCC at 402-437-2712.
