
Libraries are more than books. Libraries are about Literacy, Literature, and Learning. Lincoln loves libraries and Lincoln puts a high value on education. A survey of the citizens of Lincoln showed that 83% feel that Lincoln is doing a good job with their libraries. Libraries have become more popular for co-working spaces for entrepreneurs and people working from home. The library provides use of computers, high tech equipment and free Wi-Fi. The future of libraries will continue to see the higher tech equipment placed in such as 3-D printers etc. for those who cannot afford to go out and buy these on their own.

Another survey showed that 50% of Americans have used a library in the past


12 months. Pat talked about the Bennet Martin Library downtown which has been Lincoln's central library. The Bennet Martin library is in great need of major renovation and lacks many of the qualities in the vision for a city's central library such as parking and larger gathering spaces. It is preferred that they start over at a new location rather than investing the money into current location. The Library Board is on record supporting a new Central Library in downtown Lin-

coln. The current location's structure around a central courtyard creates limitations in use of space, staff and effective security. Even in its current condition, approximately 700 people visit Bennett Martin Library each day.

A library should be a welcoming space to gather and study. Libraries have been shifting from emphasizing space for books and other items to providing space for people to gather and use in various ways with up-to-date technology. The location that seems most appealing right now is the block on which the Pershing Center is currently located. This site best meets the criteria for the library's vision of a future Central Library.
