



Our own Nicki Klein spoke to the club Friday about the web site. She walked us through the features both on

the general website that can be accessed by the public as well as the administrative section that can only be accessed by members via password.

To access the public portion of the website you can just go to <u>LincolnSouthRotary.org</u>. There you can find information about our club, speakers, calendar, photos and stories about what the club is doing. Visitors to the public

portion of the site can also get contact information for our officers and directors.

From the home page you can click on *login* up in the right hand corner and log in to the member only portion of the site with your user name and password. This has all the same information as the public portion. If you click on *Admin* in the right hand corner you will gain access to additional information such as detailed member lists with complete contact information for each member. The Admin page gives you the ability to edit your individual profile, run reports, send emails to the club and other Rotary members of "Friends" of Rota-

ry. You can print a complete directory of members including pictures. You will only have access to the items that are active on the admin page. Some items are restricted

and not available to all members.

Nicki spent a little time discussing changes that are going to be made to the newsletter. In the near future, the newsletter will be created on the web site as an "E Bulletin" versus created with publishing software and downloaded to the website. This will allow the publisher to pick up stories that are already on the

site to put into the newsletter. The speaker bios and their topic of discussion will be published before the meeting instead of recapping what was said at the meeting. This will require those who arrange the speaker to get that information the week before the meeting. Those members who have announcements they would like to see in the newsletter can go to the website and create the story which can be picked up in the E Bulletin. A note will be sent to all members when the new process begins.

Since the Lincoln South website is hosted by the same company that hosts the District, members can use the same login and password to log in to the District website.
