

PROGRAM

On Friday a Club Assembly was

held with the topic focused on the finances of the club. President Elise handed out financial information which included the following:

- 1. Balance sheet and income statement for the 6 months ending December 31, 2011.
- 2. Budget for the Fiscal 2011-2012
- 3. Membership Dues Analysis.

The club has been running a deficit for the last several years which is consuming our reserves. The club discussed the reasons for the deficit and potential expense items that could be eliminated in future years. Several felt that running a deficit in any one year was not a particularly bad thing since the purpose of the club is not to build a large treasure chest. One suggestion in that regard to was to establish a minimum reserve of funds that the club should maintain and manage the budget to that reserve.


A membership dues analysis was presented which broke down the costs of

membership in the club including required payments to Rotary International as well as other items paid by the club. Based on the analysis, the Board plans to recommend an increase in annual dues from \$190 per year to \$215 per year with the hope that another in-

crease will not be required for several years.

The board will be voting on the increase on February 27, 2012. In the meantime, anyone with comments or concern should contact President Elise White at:
