
2014 Food Bank

- · Goal is to alleviate hunger in Southeast NE
- · Feeding the hungry is the main goal
- · In 2014 they provided 8 million plus meals
- · Connect people to meals in a variety of ways
 - o Mobile Pantry
 - o Food Stamp Outreach
 - o Rural Outreach
 - o Child Hunger Programs
 - o High School Food Markets
 - o Partner organizations: Center for People in Need, Matt Talbot Kitchen, Gathering Place, Community Ac-

tion Agencies, Catholic Social Services, People's City Mission

- 56,000 people are food insecure in the service area
- · Since 2007, Lincoln's homeless has grown by 41% 1/3 of these are kids
- They are developing a new program called "Bridges out of Poverty" that will help communities understand poverty locally, and help connect people to service that will help them get themselves out of the system
