That said we are a small state population wise and our size makes it easier to grapple with issues. Rotary members exemplify good business practices and I am proud that we take the time to celebrate and honor successful businesses each year.

2) Gabrielle Giffords is doing better as time passes and we pray for her full recovery. I was dumb struck today when I read in the Lincoln paper that a partisan emergency health care worker in Arizona refused to respond to the Gifford shooting incident because he disagreed with her political stance. I see it as a glaring example of lack of basic respect or civility towards others. I hope that Rotary will continue to exemplify the best behavior of people towards others even when faced with strong differences in political doctrines.

End Polio Now Campaign—Shahid Kamal reported that the 4 Lincoln clubs will again be collecting funds for the End Polio Now campaign at 6 locations in Lincoln on March 26, 2011. Collections will be at various Wal Mart locations and Russ's IGA. More details will be coming. Shahid reported that to date, Rotary has raised \$140 million of the \$200 million challenge from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Lincoln South Foundation Fundraiser—The annual Chili Feed to raise funds for the LSR Foundation is scheduled on March 12, 2011 at the home of John & Nancy Herdman. There will be a chili competition from 5-6 pm for those who want to enter their chili recipes. Tickets are \$25 per person with a portion of the proceeds going the grant application process and the rest to the Foundation.

Bring community service needs to the Board for grants, help increase Public Awareness of the Foundation, attend the Fundraisers, and consider what level of financial support you can provide to the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation.

Additional information is available on the Lincoln South Rotary Club Website Members of the Board of the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation presented an update at

our meeting on Friday, February 11. Joyce Schmeeckle, Ardel Harger, Lance Odom and Dean Heerman were the members addressing the club.

"The mission of the Lincoln South Rotary Foundation is to support local causes while improving our community. Through these --efforts, we strive to increase public awareness and provide lasting value to those we serve."

The goals of the Foundation include 1) \$50,000 in contributions by 2009 (Accomplished), 2)Be financially sound to fund various community projects (\$500 annually), 3)Continue annual receipt of financial commitment by Lincoln South Rotary Board (ongoing), 4) Involve members of Lincoln South Rotary Club with annual pledges and fundraising events (Annual Chili Feed and Wine Tasting), and 5)Build Endowment to \$62,500 by 2016.

The current balance of the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation is \$49,030. 40% of the contributions are from the Foundation Board (8 individuals have contributed at the \$2,500+ level), 26% is from the Lincoln South Rotary Club treasury, Members and Corporate matches, 27% is from events, and 7% is from investments (primarily Certificates of Deposit).

The Board of the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation is committed to disbursing grants twice annually for a total of \$1,000 each year. With the growth in the Foundation, we hope to increase that to \$2,000 per year by 2014. To build foundation funds we need constant, regular contributions.

It was pointed out that Lincoln South Rotary members have historically been leaders in our district in support of the Rotary International Foundation. The leadership of the Lincoln South Rotary Foundation stressed throughout the presentation that we want this support to continue. We also recognize that many of the projects of the Rotary Foundation are international in

scope and very large in size. However, there are a number of unmet needs I our community and, through a club foundation, we can help with those needs.

When the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation was started, long-time member and major donor to the Rotary International Foundation, George Lytton, struggled with the decision. He was concerned that our club might lose our focus – move a little away from the International Foundation and more toward the Club Foundation. To date, this has not been a problem.

It is hoped that members will continue their support of the Rotary Foundation, but also contribute to the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation.

Organizations that have benefited from Lincoln South Rotary Foundation Grants include 1)Lincoln Public Schools Fund-a-Need, 2)Lincoln Action Program, 3)Clinic With A Heart, 4)Ruth Hill School, 5)Fresh Start Home, 6)Spring Creek Prairie, 7) Girls on the Run, 8)Lincoln Southwest Speech and Debate Team, 9)Gil Scouts, 10)Lincoln Literacy Council, and 11)Salvation Army.



It was also announced that the Board just met and voted on funding grants to the ARC of Lincoln for entertainment equipment and Bridges of Hope – an aid to newly released prisoners with basic needs.

It was pointed out that the Foundation focuses on grants that are championed by Lincoln South Rotary Club members – so this really is YOUR Foundation.

Answering the question of "why" we should add the Lincoln South Rotary Club Foundation to your list of charities, Dean Heerman said "do it now". He shared advice that he has often shared with family, friends and clients. If you wait to give your money to others at the time you pass away, you never get to see the benefits – the joy – that your generosity gives to others.

Lincoln South Rotary Club is well-known in our community – and among our Rotarian friends in the other clubs. They see what we are doing – see the recognition that we get – due to our active membership and support of projects.

TRIP TO GEORGIA

The next trip to The Republic of Georgia will be March 18 through the 28. The current cost for flights is \$1300 - \$1400. Once in Georgia, there are few expenses as you will stay in the homes of Georgians, they will provide transportation, and almost all meals are provided. The group will visit the Divine Child Orphanage in Saguramo tovisit with children and staff and to see the materials that Lincoln South purchased for them along with our partner Rotary club Tbilisi Academia.
