Nick Broshear from Black Hills Energy spoke to the club about "How Safe is Natural Gas?" He spoke about the properties of Natural Gas and the Safety Culture that at Black Hills exists Energy. Nick is a service technician whose job is to repair gas appliances and to ensure the safe delivery of energy to customers.

Gas is lighter than air so it rises to

the highest level of an enclosed structure. It is also odorless in its natural state so an odor is added to it. Nick talked about the LEL (lower explosive level) and the UEL (upper explosive level) of natural gas. Natural Gas is only explosive at levels between 5% (which is the LEL) and 15% (which is the UEL) in the air. Lower levels are not enough to explode and higher levers are too rich to explode. He stressed that gas leaks are serious and should be reported immediately. Also, always call before you dig to make sure you know the location of the nearest gas line.




Safety is taken very seriously by the company which has weekly safety briefs to talk about safety issues and has a safety committee that meets once per month.

Black Hills Energy has 196,000 customers in 106 communities in 7 states. It provides electricity and natural gas to customers. Currently the company buys all of it's gas from outside sources

For the final entertainment, Nick brought along what he calls a Boom

Box which pumped gas into the chamber until it reached LEL at which time it exploded which brought us all out of our seats!
