Our speaker was Jeff Maul, Executive Director for Lincoln Convention & Business Bureau (and former Lincoln South Member)

The Lincoln Convention & Business Bureau is approximately 95% funded by the lodging tax which is a 4% tax on hotel bills in the City of Lincoln. Their annual budget is \$1.4 million. The primary mission of the Bureau is to educate people about what is going on in the City of Lincoln.

There are 62 lodging places in Lincoln with a total of 4,700 rooms available. Jeff indicated that we are slightly over-built as a whole right now because we don't even sell out on Husker game days. However if we look at it from the perspective of being able to attract higher profile sporting events such as NCAA tournament, we are a little under built in the full service areas of lodging within a few blocks of arena. We have seen steady growth since 2007

The number one driver of hotel business in Lincoln is youth sports not the University. Jeff mentioned that we need more facilities and fields to compete with other markets in the area of




youth sports. Religious Conferences are also huge and we look to attract more of these. Last fall we had 11,000 women attend the Faith conference for women at Pinnacle Arena.

The Lincoln Convention & Business Bureau has 7 full time employees. Their job is to make Lincoln a destination for people. They partnered with the State Tourism group and hosted 20 Travel Writers back in December and visited places like the Zoo, micro brewery's, food establishments, State Capital, Speedway

Sporting Village, Licorice International, etc. and within 24 hours had blogs out talking about our great city. We got a huge win when we won the bid for the State games of America which will be held in Lincoln this summer. We competed against San Diego on this event. There will be approximately 20,000 athletes in Lincoln to compete.

Jeff discussed the many details that go into the bidding process when competing for events. A few of the other events mentioned were the Lincoln Marathon, The Good Life Halfsy, 2016 World 10 Pin Classic, State High School tournaments, 2018 USA Bowling Championships, Sports Car Show and many others. Jeff challenged all of us to get out and do something different in the city this weekend!
