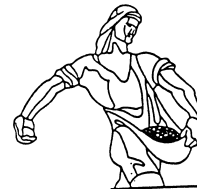

Our own Nicki Klein spoke to the club about Rotary Technology. One project that she described is the Worlds Biggest Commercial. All members are asked to take their picture holding their fingers to display that we are "this close" to eradicating polio. Then you go to the EndPolionow.org website where you can upload your photo. The photos are run on the website as a continuous commercial.

Nicki logged on to the Lincoln South Rotary website and gave the members an overview of the site which included the following information:

Without logging on, anyone can view:

1. Stories - on the Home Page the latest news and other pertinent stories are shown
2. Speaker Information - shown on the right hand side but also you can view using the Speaker Link
3. Calendar - shows club meetings and speakers but also special events of the club and some district events
4. Downloads - the latest forms and documents (such as the Chili Feed flyer and instructions for posting your photo to the This Close Ad / World's Biggest Commercial) and
5. Photo Albums - there are albums about special activities as well as one with general photos for the year (speakers, member moments, etc.)

There are a number of pages relating to the club - our history, our past awards, grants that we have participated in, community service. There are also contact links along the left side (scroll toward the bottom) to reach the officers and those responsible for specific activities in the club.

Signing on to the Club Website gives you access to update your Information and get contact Information (and even print directory listings) for other club members. Additional functionality may be available in the future with Member Logon.

In addition, you can use your same logon information to access information and processes on the District Website. You are able to look up members from other clubs in the District. You are able to sign up for meetings arranged by the District.



All members are sent a logon ID and Password when they first join Lincoln South Rotary.

These are sent in separate emails - one as an email from nklein2@neb.rr.com and one as an email through the club website (ClubRunner).

Once logged on you can change either your logon ID or your password or both.

To Logon: Go to the Admin Page Go to My ClubRunner (left panel in the center of the screen) To Change your Password, you can select the Change My Password link. To Change your Logon, select Edit My Profile, then select the settings tab and edit. Type the new logon ID and SAVE.

To Update your Information:

Using Edit My Profile you can also update your information (this is where you can enter your birth year if that is not already updated). If you did not send me your actual birth year, I put in a year that was within an age range (either one that you provided to me or one that I guessed).

Getting Member Information/Directories Under My ClubRunner on the Admin page.

Selecting View Club Directory (or with Photos) gives you a list and an active link to email any members. To get a printable directory, use eDirectory Reports - select the one that you want and open in either word or pdf (select the icon on the right).
