In the second movie people struggling with common real life problems come to realize that some people, at least, are honorable and trustworthy. Their belief in something better causes them not to settle for a banal existence.

In Rotary I like to think we are more like the characters in "It Happened One Night". Just as in the movie (a brilliant comedy) we have fun on the road of life but we also recognize a greater more noble purpose for our existence and we don't settle. We try to make the world a bit better.

PROGRAM

The speaker was Kelly Johns from Jr. Achievement. With her was Kelly Pargett, also of Jr. Achievement . Jr. Achievement is in it's 40th year in Lincoln. The focus of the group is education for students, K-12, in Financial Lit-

eracy, Entrepreneurship, and Work Leadership. There are 126 Jr. Achievement offices in the U.S. and an additional 100 worldwide. The founding principles of the organization were to focus on economic education.

In Lincoln/

Lancaster County, there are 18,000 kids in the program through the schools across Lancaster County - K-12 - and tey were tought by 650+ volunteers. It is a hands-on interactive training in the classrooms of 72 schools, both public and private. The program is in approximately 845 classrooms.

They are always looking for more volunteers. Volunteers are required to make around 5 to 10 visits each year. Each visit lasts between 30 minutes and 45 minutes. Some of the things taught to the early grades include: savings principles, teamwork, sharing, what money looks like, trading,

the differences between needs and wants, why we have jobs, basic entrepreneurship, and basic money principles, such as balancing a c h e c k b o o k.

Jr. Achievement has 3 staff people, and is run solely on private funds. They host three events every

year - a Bowl-A-Thon, a Dinner/Silent Auction, and a Golf Tournament.
