

Brian Hardinger with NUtech Ventures was our speaker. NUtech Ventures is an entity created by the University of Nebraska with the goal to take simple. innovative ideas and turn them into small businesses or licensing agreements. Often the ideas com from cur-

rent University of Nebraska students and faculty, but there are others that come from outside entities that partner with NUtech. NUtech considers itself as an active R&D matchmaker who brings the private sector and academia together for mutually beneficial collaboration. NUtech will connect companies with University of Nebraska researchers to help them develop new products or solve challenging research problems. also link entrepreneurs and investors with researchers who have leadingedge technologies with startup potential. They match researchers with industry partners who have the resources and commitment to commercialize their technologies. Then once the connection is made, the NUtech team supports the partnership to ensure results are realized.



One of their events which is scheduled for March 14th, 28th and April 4th, 11th & 18th is their NUtech Entrepreneur Bootcamp which is an intensive training course in what it takes to turn an idea into a high-tech business. Participants can hear about topics such as business model generation, customer development, team building, legal basics and financing from people who are in the business.

N/Motion is another program that includes seminars on various topics to help startups to move forward faster.

Some of the research areas include Animal Health & Vaccines, Biotech & Pharma, Clean Energy & Infrastructure, Food Nutrition & Water, Improved Crop Genetics, Advanced Materials & Nanotech, Software & IT and Standout Innovation.

Some of the success stories include: Huddle, Bulu Box, Social Assurance, Herdat and Bultive.
