Friday. Dr.Rauner spoke to the club about the Partnership for a Healthy Lincoln which is charged with improving the health and well being of Lincoln's citizens and encouraging healthy lifestyles through community initiatives.

From the 1960's to 2009, health insurance costs have increased in the US at a much quicker pace than other countries while life expectancies are worse in the US than those countries. Surprisingly healthy behaviors are the biggest factor in this statistic while access to

health care represents only about 10% of the decrease.

The main causes of the lower life expectancies in order are as follows:

- 1 Homicide
- 2 Transport injury (Leading cause of car wrecks is texting)
- 3 Non transport injuries (drug overdoses)
- 4 Peri-natal (premature births primarily due to teen pregnancy)
- 5 Heart Disease and Diabetes (primarily caused by obesity) -

Item 5 is by far the most expensive since a person can live with heart disease and diabetes for years and they are very expensive to treat. Items 1-4 will kill you right away.

Obesity has increased from 10% to 35% just in the last 10 years.

Why has body weight increased so dramatically? Liquid calories are the number one cause followed by portion size, junk food which has less bulk to fill you up but is dense with calories and finally lack of physical activity.

Until recently recess had been virtually eliminated in Lincoln schools and the siting of new schools which are no longer in neighborhoods makes it more difficult for kids to walk to school.


The good news is that obesity rates in Lincoln Public Schools are improving which will ultimately decrease long term health care costs.

In recent years more focus has been placed on fitness instead of weight and the school districts have developed fitness tests for students. Studies have shown that fitness level impacts academics while obesity does not.

LPS is also focusing not only on students but teacher health as well.

Ultimately changes need to be made to the healthcare system which currently focuses on short term solutions.
