

Bob Balfany, Lincoln Market President for US Bank was our speaker. Bob spoke to the club about the banking industry and gave an

overview of US-Bank. Bob is on the board of the Nebraska Dept of Banking as well as the Chamber of Commerce, both of which have given him great perspective on

the economy and the banking industry in Nebraska. Banking showed the first net loss nationwide as an Industry in 2008. During that time Nebraska banks as a whole were still profitable and have staved relatively stable. The balancing act that banks currently face is not to have underwriting standards too loose so they take on too much risk, while at the same time not having standards so tight that it restricts growth. An additional challenge in Nebraska is that the Ag economy has been so good that farmers are not borrowing which reduces the banks source of income. Some of the challenges ahead

for 2013 include the narrowing of margins between loan rates and deposit rates as the loans begin to reprice in the current low rate environ-

> ment and increase in the number of regulations which causes uncertainty. Too much regulation can be just as harmful as too little and we need some certainty from Washington right now.

The banking

system in the US is pretty strong but Europe is still having problems. New technology is a plus and should help the banking industry.

US Bank is the 5th largest bank in the US that still remains a traditional bank with loans, deposits and customer service. Bob shared some key statistics about the bank such as number of employees, # banks, major customers. US Bank is also very community minded and contributes to a number of great organizations through its foundation.

Hello dear Rotarians!

Lying in my bed, I was suddenly struck with a great feeling of gratification for all your efforts and sacrifices you made for me, non the less for other people. I guess it has taken until now to realize just how much it has affected my life, in other words about 9 years. I cant believe how long it has been.

Sometimes you might wonder just how your efforts translate into other peoples lives. Therefore I want to tell you how the experience you made possible affected my life. Both the Werner and Robets familys really gave me great support, but they did not do it all alone. I remember Jenny Cardwell helping me with papers, going on a road trip with Nicki Klein. I cannot name them all - other members helped me with golf clubs and stay in their homes when the Roberts were away.

Probably there are many more things that I cant remember. Except for all those things, I have really great memories from your weekly meetings. You treated me nicely and with great understanding. You seemed to treat each other no differently.

Overall you gave me a very positive feeling, that I personally have found in very few places.

Even though I was so young, so alone, in another part of the world. The South Lincoln club members really made me feel safe and very loved. This has given me great self confidence, and a sense of anything being achievable. <u>Simply</u> <u>a great foundation to succeed in life.</u>

For the last four years I have been working as a salesman part time, as well running a company which buys and lets condos. Within a few months I am going to travel around the world and maybe work abroad. Where I end up will be interesting to see.

Besides being happy, all I know is that I will be a Rotarian in the future.
