Recently as I was preparing to leave the United States to visit the country of Georgia (Sakartvelo) on the Black sea I am thinking about a BBC radio broadcast I heard on the way to work today. In itself it is kind of amazing that I can listen to several international stations at the push of a button in my car whiling driving down the highway. Not that long ago (it seems) I was listening to

shortwave radio broadcasts and was thrilled to listen to Radio Netherlands, Quito Ecuador, Moscow, Havana, Cape Town, etc. I remember clearly how broadcast quality was subject to variations in cloud cover, solar flares, time of day etc. The broadcasts were often scratchy. As a youth I was always enthralled by hearing voices from other countries. Because of the Iron curtain it was particularly interesting to me to hear people speak about daily life in communist countries. Now through social media we can talk to people around the world with relative ease.

I wish we could transport aid to people with such ease. Back to the broadcast this morning.... it was with a woman in Japan at one of the areas devastated by the earth quake, tsunami and now a nuclear radiation threat. Besides all that, the temperature was/is hovering around freezing and there is little or no food available. With debris strewn roads the ability to deliver aid is seriously hampered. The BBC reporter ascertained pretty quickly that his woman interviewee was cold and hungry and with little prospect for relief. She said to the reporter yes, we are hungry and yes many people are dying.

It is my hope that someday Rotary will be in a position to be a first line responder for such catastrophes. In Rotary we tend to do a good job planning and thinking critically and proactively about ventures. We need more people like that in the world!

### PROGRAM

Our speaker for the day was Dr Ellen Weisinger, Sr. Vice Chancellor at UNL who spoke to the club about the academic impact of Nebraska's move to the Big 12.

Late in May of last year when the rumors started, all the faculty thought that it was highly unlikely that UNL would be given the opportunity to join the Big 10. On the Monday before the news conference announcing the move.



Chancellor Harvey Perlman gathered all of the Vice Chancellors together to inform them. Everyone was astounded and could not believe that this good thing was happening. Dr. Weisinger stressed that Nebraska is gaining a greater advantage by far on the academic side than it is gaining in athletics. She felt however had we not had a large successful, honorable athletic department that we would not have been considered.

The advantages on the academic side are many. The Big 10 contains the top 3 universities in the country by reputation. UNL has already noticed a benefit in attracting quality faculty who are eager to work for a Big 10 school due to the prestige. They have also noticed more interest from students in the big 10 area who are now including Nebraska as an option. Freshman applications are up 18% from the Big 10 states this year. One of the biggest advantages is

> the Committee on Institutional Cooperation (CIC) which creates a mutual benefit for all schools in the Big 10 and makes it easier for the schools to collaborate on all things from leveraging lower costs for equipment to driving down

the costs to pay publishers for books. The CIC recently bought a large fiber network to all schools and UNL is already connected.

The Big 10 has a consortium for students who want to study abroad whereby they can participate in programs on any Big 10 campus and pay local campus rates.

There are many leadership development experiences for faculty as well such as the Affinity groups which group faculty of like interests such as chemistry professors.

Dr Weisinger felt that the move was very positive for academics at UNL and is excited for expanded possibilities for the University.


