

Ron Ecklund, a CPA here in town and also an avid stamp collector was our speaker. Did you know the name for a stamp collector is Philatelist?

Ron has been an avid stamp collector since he was young and he shared the wealth of information that he gets from researching the various stamps that he has collected over the years. He gets information about famous or not so famous People, Places, Arts, Sports, History, Science and Geography to name a few. When he sees an unusual item on a stamp he researches the subject to find out about it. In 1999 the

United States Post Office released a book with 15 stamps from each decade of the 1st 2 centuries to celebrate the Bi-Centennial.

There are nuances that make some stamps more valuable than others including if they are rare (ie not very many produced) if they are included in a complete set and even the number of perforations per centimeter can impact the value.

He explained the difference between a post card and a postal card which has the postage pre-printed on the card and showed some examples.




There is a government committee that is all volunteers which selects the subjects for stamps. He buys most of his stamps at the Lincoln Stamp show or from private estate auctions.

Stamp collecting is very therapeutic for him and something you can do any time.

50-75 years ago it was a very prestigious hobby and collections were very valuable. Franklin Roosevelt was an avid collector.

In the end, the story behind the stamps is what is most interesting to him.

ABC'S OF ROTARY- ROTARY ANN'S

In many Rotary clubs throughout the world, wives of make members are affectionately called "Rotary Ann's". This designation was never one of disparagement, but rather grew out of an interesting historical occasion. The year was 1914 when San Francisco Rotarians boarded a special train to attend the Rotary Convention being held in Houston. In those days, few wives attended Rotary events, and until the train stopped in Los Angeles, the only woman aboard was the wife of Rotarian Bru Brunnier. As the train picked up additional convention-bound delegates, Mrs. Ann Brunnier was introduced as the Rotarian's Ann. This title soon became "Rotary Ann." Since the clubs of the West were inviting the Rotarians to hold their next convention in San Francisco, a number of songs and stunts were organized that would be performed in Houston. One of the Rotarians wrote a "Rotary Ann" chant. On the train's arrival at the Houston depot, a delegation greeted the West Coast Rotarians. One of the greeters was Guy Gundaker of Philadelphia, whose wife was also named Ann. During the rousing demonstration, someone started the Rotary Ann chant. The two petite ladies, Ann Brunnier and Ann Gundaker, were hoisted to the men's shoulders and paraded about the hall. The group loved the title given to the two women named Ann. Immediately the same term of endearment was used for all of the wives in attendance, and the name "Rotary Ann" was here to stay.

Guy Gundaker became the president of Rotary International in 1923 and Bru Brunnier was elected president in 1952. Thus, each of the two original Rotary Ann's became the "first lady of Rotary International."
