PROGRAM

Jenny Cardwell, Program Chairman, introduced the program which was a report and discussion of the Rotary Youth Leadership Award camp.

Tom Cardwell is the District chair of the

RYLA committee. He is the Dean of Student Services at Southeast Community College. Jim Pink is the District cochair of RYLA. He is president elect of the Seward Rotary Club. He is retired from governmental

services which involved technology. He has previously had a ten year involvement with RYLA camps in California.

Tom Cardwell stated that Jim is a great partner for the efforts in this District to get a new program going.

Many Lincoln South Rotary Club members are playing an integral part in getting this new program established.

RYLA started about twenty years ago and was originally an international program. This can be run at the club, district or multi district level.

The role of the Rotary Clubs is to support the effort and find interest other club to make it happen. Such program may be critical to Rotary growth in the future.

The RYLA curriculum is an intensive three day experience. Each student is awarded \$200 to attend this camp.

The curriculum includes:

Fundamentals of leadership

Ethics of positive leadership with an emphasis Importance of community

Problem solving Conflict management Building self confidence and self esteem

Discussing the elements of community and global citizenship

What is Rotary and what does it do?

Discussions will include the Rotary Four Way Test and the Avenues of Service. It will be possible for the campers to explore new career paths and hear form successful leaders and professional.

Camp Catron offers many outdoor activities. There will be team building small groups. The final project for the groups will be to develop a Rotary type international challenge or service project. They will discuss the funding and implementation of the project. Final presentation of projects will be on Sunday morning prior to the completion of the camp.
