RYLA is open to Juniors in High School and some students feel that the program has such a major impact . . . maybe even has changed their life. Tom Cardwell is the Rotary District 5650 Chair of RYLA and we also have a number of others members who volunteer for the event. This year it will be from April 17 through April 19 at Camp Kitaki.

**Grocery Grab**—a major fundraiser for our scholarship funds is the Grocery Grab. This is an opportunity for someone to "run around the Russ's store at 33rd & Hwy 2 and get as many groceries as they can in 3 minutes (maximum \$1,000). 
Each contestant gave a short speech and answered a few questions. The winners were as follows:
