PROGRAM

Tom Cardwell, Dean of Student Support Services at Southeast Community College, introduced the program which was a report on Pakistan by two students from the Pakistan Fellowship program. Yasmeen Begal and Saquih Bilal are attending SCC for one semester under the program.

The students presented an informative slide show which described the history of Pakistan, its cultures and customs. Pakistan was formed in August of 1947 in order to separate from India. It was formerly a British colony and was ruled for over 100 years.

The flag of Pakistan is green and white. The green signifies the majority of Muslims and the white signifies the minorities in the country. Even though Pakistan separated from India, in its history, there is no caste system in the country.

The government of Pakistan is a parliamentary form. There is a President and a Prime Minister. There 342 National Assembly members which are voted upon by the people. There are 100 members of the Senate which are appointed.

Urdu is the national language although there are over 60 languages. Many residents speak English. The symbols of the national language are read from left to right.

There is freedom of religion in Pakistan. Islam accounts for 98% of the population. The Christian population represents 2%. Hindu represents 1.6% and Buddhism is .0001%.

Women in Pakistan play an important role in government, science, and culture.

Over 60% of the population of Pakistan is involved in agriculture. The crops grown there are wheat, rice, and cotton. Pakistan is the 4th largest grower of apricots. Farmers use irrigation from the Indus River to improve the crop yields.

Some interesting facts about Pakistan:

Pakistan has the 6th largest standing armed forces in the world

The currency is the rupee.

The national game is hockey. Squash is one other sport they play.

Pakistan won the 1992 World Cup in cricket.

The capital of Pakistan is Islamabad.

Mining operations include petroleum, limestone, rock salt, natural gas, and coal.

A question and answer session followed the presentation.
