#### PRESIDENT'S CORNER



Politics and religion do matter of course. They reflect what is in our soul and how we want to live among others. When to speak up and when to keep silent is not always clear.

In life there is a balance to be struck between doing what you think is right and not offending people. Of course usually doing what is right is acceptable to

most concerned. However there are times when you may choose to take an "adverse" stance on something that is important to other people. As you know (unless you are a sociopath) it isn't easy to do. Challenging someone's fundamental belief system is not easy. People (all of us) usually get hurt and/or offended and cannot understand how someone might feel differently about something so important to them (or us). Furthermore, it doesn't feel good to hurt others.

All of us hold certain political or religious beliefs and sometimes we are not even sure why because we were often indoctrinated in to that belief system from a very young age. Regardless of the thought process (or lack of) used to come to our opinions we hold them with fervor. They often cut to the core of how we identify ourselves. If someone questions these beliefs we are hyper-attentive, predisposed to reject the "attacker", poised to counter attack and not often able to see any wisdom in the "attackers" opinion. Sometimes if we know someone well enough to trust that they don't mean us harm we may actually listen to their views, and perhaps even incorporate small changes in our own world view. Even more rarely, we may really question our core beliefs and become converts to a new way of thinking. Others (unfortunately) never change anything and over time become rigid and intellectually dead.

The key to discourse on difficult subjects is to set emotion aside and really listen to challengers or attackers with one's eyes, mind and heart. We may or may not change our minds but we will understand the person (s) better and at least be able to imagine how they might feel that way. In Rotary as a rule we try harder than most people to understand other points of view. We actually seek out people with alternate world views, welcome them and seek to know them. We may even become good friends with people even though we might disagree on some fundamental principles of governance or religious belief. It's cool! :))


