The speaker was Talal Raza form Lahore Pakistan. He is here on an a US State Dept. sponsored IREX Pakistan undergraduate fellowship. It is a competitive prestigious fellowship that he was awarded to study in the united States for 1 semester. He arrived in Nebraska in January and will go home on June 10th. His major is mass communications.

Pakistan is a rural country. The population is about 180 million people. It started as a country in 1947, and was formerly a British Colony. It was under British rule as a part of India from 1857 t. o 1947. Muhammed Ali Jihhah is the Founder of flag is Pakistan. The green and white. The

green represents the muslim population and the white represents the other minorities. Together it represents them all being on country. The crescent and the star on the flag are Muslim symbols.

The country exports products to India and China frequently and this is because of the relatively low cost of transport. The country, being 64 years old, was under a dictatorship for 33 years and under democracy for 31 years. The

people of the country do not seem to care which it is, as long as they have facilities available to them and things  $r\ u\ n\ s\ m\ o\ o\ t\ h\ l\ y\ .$ 

The Government is a parliamentary form of government with a President and a Prime Minister. There is a National Assembly has 342 members and the Senate has 100

members. These two bodies make up the parliament.

There is a diversity between the North and the South parts of the Country. There are 60 or so languages, but Urdu is the official language. The food in Pakistan is spicy and they use

lots of oil. They have a lot of rice and wheat used, but little meat - especially pork, because of the Muslim law. In order to own alcohol you have to have a license. The religion is approximately 95% Muslim and the rest Christian, Hindu, and Buddhist. Approximately 60% of the population is associated with ag production in some way or another
