



President Pat Grewe filled in as our speaker for the day. Pat spoke to the club about a bicycling trip that he made around Glacier National Park and Waterton Park in Canada.

The 2 parks together form a national Peace Park. Pat and his riding partner Tom Wise started riding in Whitefish Montana. They visited Little Bighorn cemetery where general Custer fell. The ceme-

tery is now a military cemetery but also has plots for Custer's Indian scouts.

Saturday July 25th they found their way to Striker Montana. They came into tobacco valley but there was no tobacco there. They went to Jerry's saloon where there was a hitching post for your horse or bike. Sunday July 26th they were in Eureka Montana and left the US for Canada. They noted that Canadian cigarettes are very expensive at \$15/ pack. They stayed in hotels every night. Once they started to get into the mountains, they went through Crows nest pass. The highest point on the trip was 6,600 feet. They came down the pass and crossed a lake. Pat liked the picture he took there so much that he made it his cover photo on



F a c e b o o k . They came to an old church that had been converted to a c off e e h o u s e. They ended in Blairmore and went back to Waterton Village. This village has quite a

story as a large part of the mountain there broke off and wiped out the whole town.

They saw some farms and some wind farms. The weather was cold & rainy so they stayed at the Bear Mountain Hotel in the park. The next day they rode from Waterton Village to St Mary Montana. This was a very steep ride as they made their way through cattle on the rode as well as other bicyclists. They road through Glacier National Park on the "Going to the Sun" road which was a little scary since there was a lot of traffic.

The scenery was spectacular with beautiful mountain streams and they met many interesting people on the trip.
