
District Conference—There will be no meeting at the Knolls on Friday May 17th as the District Conference will substitute as the regular meeting.



Lillian exchanged banners from her Rotary Club "Rotary de Marceio Farol" which is one of 90 clubs in her district. Lillian and each of the team members told the club about the area where they were from and about their respective professions. Some of the highlights included:

Brazil is a very diverse country with people from many cultures. The primary agricultural products are sugar cane, corn, oranges and beans. Petroleum is also a big industry in the country along with diamond and marble mines.

The area of Sergipe is rich in folklore and has the 4th oldest city in Brazil. The area of Alagoas has beautiful beaches. The area of Bahia was discovered by the Portuguese. Brazil has 27 states but all are governed from the Federal level. There are no separate state governments.

Brazil is looking forward to 2 major events, the World Cup in 2014 and the Olympics in 2016. Everyone was invited to come visit.
