Shawna Kolbek, MSW, the Director of Trio Student Support Services at SCC was the speaker. The Trio program is a federal program funded through the Department of Education that assists students who are academically challenged and meet another of the following criteria: 1st Generation College student, low income, or living with a documented disability. Mostly, these students are older, female, have a disability, are a minority, speak English as a second language, have a GED rather than a high school diploma, are a single parent. Often they are not academically prepared, have an outside job, function in a high stress environment, and feel immense pressure to succeed in their academic endeavors.



Nebraskans have a bachelor's degree or a higher.

In Nebraska, there are 12 post-secondary institutions that offer a trio program, one of them being Southeast Community College. These programs offer counseling, course selection, financial aid and scholarship application assistance, services to improve economic and financial literacy, and they try to expose students to cultural events and academic programs usually

not made available to low income students. They are also provided with peer support, donated textbooks, and are encouraged with their engagement in the local and global community.

The graduation rate for low income students is 11% as opposed to 55% for those students in middle to high income brackets. Additionally, on 27% of
