

PROGRAM

Chan Tyrell, Vice President of the Foundation at Tabitha was our speaker for the

day. Chan spoke to the club about Meals on Wheels which was started in 1967 for people who were convalescing from a hospital stay and has now become a program to help elders stay in their homes.

The program has become much more than providing meals as the volunteers may be the only social contact that many of the recipients get each day. The volunteers are also instructed to check the clients well being while they are there and alert the home office if something does not seem right. He told many stories

of volunteers helping clients out of a dangerous health situation. Since all of the recipients are homebound, they represent a hidden population of sorts who has to make hard choices when money is tight. Sometimes food is the first thing they sacrifice.

The cost of the meals is \$5.50 (which represents the cost of the food only) but 70% of the recipients pay a reduced rate or nothing at all. Tabitha has committed to provide meals to anyone who is eligible, regardless of their ability to pay. This requires them to do additional fundraising to cover the cost of the program which is projected to lose approximately \$100,000 this year. Tabitha used to be able to subsidize the program from their reserves but with recent changes in Medicaid reimbursement, they are no longer able to do so.

Tabitha has a network of over 700 volunteers who work to deliver the meals each day. Since Tabitha delivers every day of the year including weekends and holidays, volunteers are needed 365 days a year. Since inception there have been only

15 days when meals did not get delivered because of the weather which is an astonishing record. The volunteer pool is also aging so Chan stressed the importance of

getting the next generation

involved.

This year Tabitha is serving in excess of 450 meals per day which is up 11% from last year so the need is growing.

Chan closed the program by giving Lincoln South Rotary a big thank you for providing volunteers for the program since 1995. Joe Roberts also thanked our own Ardel Harger who has coordinated the Lincoln South delivery teams since the beginning of the Lincoln

South participation in the program. If anyone who has not volunteered is interested, please contact Ardel.
