


#### **PROGRAM**

Frank Chambers, Ambassador for Community Development Resources (CDR) was our speaker. The company was initially started in 1994 by Rick Wallace as the Self Employed Loan Fund (SELF). Don Clifton from the Gallup



CDR is governed by an all volunteer board and provides financial products & services to small businesses that are underserved by traditional financial markets. They seek to bridge the gap between loans and services available to the economic mainstream and those offered to low-income people and communities.

Their first loan was \$1,000 made in 1995 to a hairdresser. Since then they have made 281 loans totaling 5.3 million to companies which have created 600 new



CDR operates a New Community Business Center on the 5th floor of the old Gallup building where they offer technical assistance and teach business basics to potential small business owners. To receive a loan an individual or business is required to have a business plan. CDR partners with the Senior Core of Re-

95% to 97% of the loans are repaid which is the result of the technical assistance provided before the loans are made.

tired Executives (SCORE) to help with

the business plans.

CDR receives funding from low rate loans from banks, Federal Funds related to the CDFI designation and the Lincoln Community Foundation.
