Pam Dingman, Lancaster County Engineer was our speaker. Pam is the first woman elected County Engineer in Nebraska. The main function of the County Engineer's Office is to design, construct, inspect, maintain and repair county roads, streets and bridges.

County maintained roads include 50 miles of dirt roads, 1,000 miles of gravel roads and 272 miles of paved roads. There are 306 bridges in

the county and 80 of those bridges are greater than 50 years old. The oldest was built before 1900.

The County surveyor in the office makes and records land surveys, reviews land subdivision requests and land access approvals. The office also prepares plat maps and drawings and is the first county to use GIS to create maps. In fact they have created a database to use to document damage in emergencies such as floods to facilitate reporting to FEMA.

They have a maintenance department that is responsible for maintaining 18 buildings in 4 Districts as well as maintenance for all of the heavy equipment and vehicles in the County. They also make all of their own signs that are used throughout



the County. Pam indicated that sign vandalism cost the County \$26,000 last year. For safety reasons they need to get road signs back up as soon as possible once they are damaged or destroyed.

This year they will be focused on resurface projects and paving and grading projects. There is no budget for

bridges this year even though there are 9 bridges in the County that need to be replaced. In fact the need is much greater in all areas than the available budget.

Pam spent some time talking about the recent flooding and showing photos of damage. 28 bridges in the County were damaged by the flood. She also discussed their Emergency Operations Center where she goes during such emergencies. She mentioned that the damage from the recent floods would have been much greater without the improvements done in connection with the Antelope Creek Project.
