Former Nebraska Secretary of State (from 1971 to 1994) Allen Beermann was our speaker.

Allen presented a whimsical look at life -

He shared a story about how complicated it can be to give a small gift when attorneys get involved – just to make a point about how concerned we are with liabilities, etc.

He urged us to consider the words of William Ward:

I will do more than belong, I will participate.

I will do more than care, I will help. I will do more than believe, I will practice. I will do more than be fair, I will be kind. I will do more than forgive, I will forget. I will do more than dream, I will work. I will do more than teach, I will inspire. I will do more than earn, I will enrich. I will do more than live, I will grow. I will do more than be friendly; I will be a friend.

I will do more than be a citizen; I will be a patriot

As he continued his life lessons he challenged us all to "Aspire to Inspire before we Expire".

Never do work for recognition. Do work that is worthy of recognition

Go through life like a snowflake – leave a mark, not a stain.

Life is full of "G" forces. Each of us has the opportunity to experience

these "G" forces.

The first G is to be Good...try to be ethical, honest

The second G is to be Grateful. Say thank you often and be appreciative

The third G is to be Gracious...being nice will enrich your life


The fourth G is to be Generous...share your time, energy and treasure

The fifth G is to be Glad...enjoy life, be happy , have fun along the way


