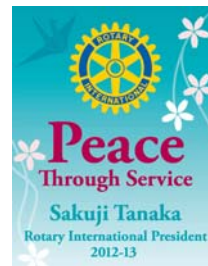
Visiting Rotarians and Guests

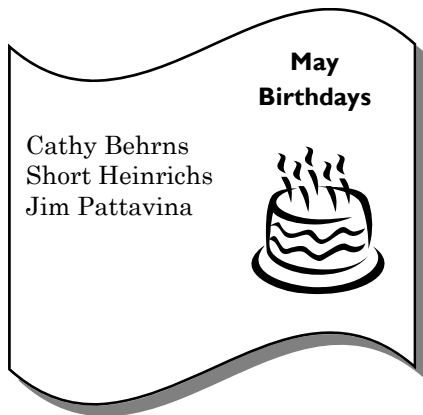

Our speaker Friday was Razia Sultana, an exchange student from Pakistan attending Southeast Community College.

Pakistan was created on August 13, 1947. It's 4 major crops are wheat, cotton, tea and jute. The country borders China, Iraq and India and the capital is Islamabad. The National Language is Urdu but only about 8% of the people speak it. While many of the inhabitants speak Punjabi, Pushtal and Sindhi, English is the official language of Pakistan. In fact it is the 9th largest English speaking country in the world. 97% of the citizens of Pakistan are Muslim and there are still arranged marriages.

The main sport in the country is cricket. Polo, hockey and boxing are also popular. The foods are very spicy and bread is a very important part of the diet. Tourism is important and varied. Razia showed us a video of some of the beautiful scenery in the country with the national song.

Razia had 2 brothers and one sister. She is studying business and hopes to work in a financial institution. The thing that she misses most about Pakistan is the spicy food.

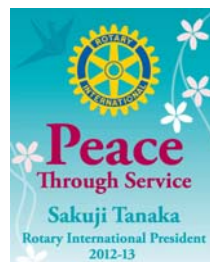
