


Notes & Announcements

As well all names of members throughout the District were placed in a drawing and a number of Lincoln South Rotary Club Members won gifts in that drawing with gifts such as Girl Scout Cookies, Handmade Jelly, Rotary Mug, Candle, Gift Cards.

District Conference Awards—Nicki Klein reported that Lincoln South Rotary again did very well at the District Conference. The club was one of only 12 clubs to win the Presidential Citation and also won the Outstanding Medium Sized Club in the District and most importantly Lincoln South Again took #1 in the top ten clubs competition. Way to go Lincoln South!

Dues Statements—Member Dues billings have been sent and dues should be paid as soon as possible. We will soon need to submit our payment to Rotary International for member dues.

Strike Out Polio—The Strike Out Polio Saltdogs Game has been scheduled for Friday, July 26, 2013. The four Rotary Clubs of Lincoln as well as Seward and Ashland will be participating this year. Tickets for the game are \$16, with half of the sales price* coming back to the clubs to support the effort to end polio. The seats are Club Level Seats which are upper deck behind home plate with access to the exclusive club and the option of a full bar and buffet dinner. We will also be selling raffle tickets to throw out the first pitch - \$1 per chance or 8 chances for \$5. PROGRAM

Our own Jessica Kolterman who serves as the Director of NFBF-PAC and State Governmental Relations for the Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation, along with her colleague Anthony Aerts who is the Assistant Director of State Government Affairs, gave the club an update on the first session of the 103rd Nebraska Legislature. During the 90 day session 661 bills were introduced and 214 of those bills became law. The bills covered such issues as tax reform, the biennial budget, education funding, water funding and wind energy development.

Several tax bills were introduced including bills on Loss Carryforwards, Ag Repair Parts sales tax exemptions Ag Land Property Taxes and Inheritance Tax Rates.

The biennial budget totaled \$7.8 billion which represented a 5.2% increase. Key items in the budget included \$906 million for K-12 funding, a 2 yr UNL and state college tuition freeze, \$115 million to the Property Tax Credit Program refunding and an increase of the cash reserve to \$627 million.

An interim task force has been created to identify and prioritize state water funding needs in four areas: 1. Data a modeling; 2. Integrated management; 3. Infrastructure and 4. Compact compliance.


Five of the major legislative bills were filibustered including the Death

Penalty Repeal, Medicaid Expansion, Corn Check-off Restructuring and the Nebraska Environmental Trust.

Three policy successes included bills on Juvenile Justice, Livestock Cruelty and Wildfire Control.
