


## **Notes & Announcements**

#### **PROGRAM**

Our own Jessica Kolterman Director of NFBF-PAC and State Government Relations gave a wrap-up of the

State Legislative session. 704 bills were introduced in the session and 269 of those bills were signed by the Governor. Some of the major issues included:

- Highway Funding directing sales tax revenue towards road funding starting in 2013.
- Water Funding— Use of Environmental Trust Funds to address water challenges
- Economic Development— 6 bills intro-

duced including Nebraska Internship Act, Business Innovation Act, Site and Building Development Act, Angel Investment Credit Act, Economic Gardening Act and local Economic Development Funding.

- Adopted a 2 year budget with goal to close projected \$943 million budget gap.
  - Bills introduced to close budge gat by eliminating state aid to counties, cities and NRD's and adjusting state aid formula to reduce state aid to schools.
  - Commission of Industrial Relations (CIR created to resolve labor and wage disputes between political subdivisions and government employees.
  - Redistricting
