Luke Dorris, Chief Meteorologist for KLKN TV was our speaker. Luke shared with the club his story of why he became a meteorologist. He was working at a beer distributor which got hit by a powerful storm which destroyed half of the warehouse. From that point on he was interested in weather phenomenon. He was fortunate to work in the National Weather Center in Oklahoma houses the Storm Prediction Center that does all the weather watches for the US. He also was a storm chaser for 3 years.

Most meteorologists do research or television meteorology. Luke works on the TV side and does all of his own forecasts and graphics. Satellites, Radar and weather balloons are some of the tools used for forecasting. Twice each day weather balloons are released all over the US to obtain data such as temperature, wind and air pressure. The data is fed into computers which analyze the data and how it changes over time. Reports are produced showing different ensembles or views of what will happen over time. The closer the views are the chances are higher that a weather event will occur such as rain. When the ensembles are all over the board, forecasters use averages.



Why are forecasts wrong? Several reasons include: 1. There are not enough weather balloons to get enough data to be more accurate. (Only 2 balloons are released in Nebraska which does not give much coverage) 2. Computer limitations 3. Math assumptions used in the forecasting process.

He then described how some weather phenomena form such

as Severe Thunderstorms or Super Cells. Interesting to note that flash floods kill more people than anything. He described the formation process for tornados. Prime time for occurrence in Nebraska is from 3-7 in the afternoon during June. Most tornados are less than 100 yards wide and size does not equate with the strength of the tornado. Many smaller tornados have been the strongest. The US has the most tornados in the world due to the impact of mountains in west, cold Canada air from the north and warm moist air from the south which is the perfect recipe for tornados to form.
