Polio Fundraiser—Aaron Babcock has contributed Husker Illustrated yearbooks to be sold at \$10 apiece as a fundraiser for Polio with 100% of the proceeds going to polio eradication.

End Polio Now Event—Nicki Klein reported Lincoln is very close to its goal for raising its portion of the \$200 million Challenge Grant to Rotary International from the Bill Gates. To raise the remainder of the funds, the Lincoln Rotary Clubs have scheduled a "Strike Out Polio" event at the Salt Dogs game on August 19th. Tickets for the club section behind home plate will be \$16 each with 1/2 of the proceeds going to polio eradication. The goal is to sell 243 tickets which is the capacity of the club section. There also will be opportunities to qualify to throw out the first pitch.

Our own Nicki Klein was our

speaker on Friday. Nicki gave a presentation on the new Lincoln South Web Site. Even though many refer to the site as "Club Runner", that is actually the name of the company that cre-



ated the website software which is used by many Rotary clubs across the country.

Nicki navigated through the public portion of the website showing articles about the club including officers, directors and committees as well as a history of awards taken home both by the club and individual members. There is also a section with photos of club events and meetings as well as links to the Lincoln South newsletter and to the District and Rotary International web sites.

Nicki then logged on to the MEM-BERS ONLY PAGES to show the members the wealth of information that can be found there. Nicki has provided everyone with a login and password but if you no longer have the information, contact Nicki and she can re send. If you have logged in and changed your pass word but have forgotten it, she cannot give you your current pass-

> word but she can change it for you so you can get logged in.

> The most important information in the Member pages is the club directory which

contains a photo and personal details about each member. You can update your information on your own, but if you do that, please notify Nicki so she can update her master lists.

You can also email club members through the email message center. You can email the entire member list or just selected members. Also if you have a group of members that you email on a regular basis, contact Nicki and she can set up a distribution list for you.

The ultimate goal with the club runner software is to give committee chairs admin authority to be able to write articles and post information on the web site. These articles can then be pulled into the E -bulletin which will eventually serve as the weekly newsletter.
