



Brent Meyer, Lancaster County Weed Control Superintendent and self professed

"weed nerd" was our speaker. His department is responsible for ensuring compliance with the Nebraska Noxious Weed Control Act and weed abatement in Lancaster County and also weed abatement in the City of Lincoln through an interlocal agreement between the county and the city.

Noxious weeds must be kept no taller than 6" on any property. In addition to weeds designated as noxious weeds under the Act, the county also does weed abatement of worthless vegetation which is defined as vegetation that is

overgrown, mature and not serving a beneficial use or uncontrolled. This worthless vegetation needs to be controlled for a number of reasons:



- 2. Crowds out good plants
- 3. Decreases property values
- 4. Violates the law
- 5. Is unsightly
- 6. Attracts pests
- 7. Can cause health problems
- 8. Is a fire hazard
- 9. Can be an aggressive spreader.

Property owners are responsible for weed abatement on their prop-

erty and also from their property line to the center of any adjoining street or alley. if your property has a fence around the perimeter, you are required to cut on both sides of the fence even if it is right on your property line. greater than 1 acre are required to cut weeds back 50 ft from each border and cut everything to 6" after the growing season. Also properties on an intersection are required to

keep 30" from the curb free of obstructions. If property owners do not clean up the weeds, the county will contract it done and bill the owner for the cost. Not surprisingly rental properties are a big problem. In 2014 they cut 289 properties and enforced 2 noxious weed violations.

He showed pictures of the different types of noxious weeds including escaped ornamentals such as purple loosestrife, knotweed and salt cedar (some of which are still sold as ornamentals but are very invasive) as well as the better known such as Musk Thistle, Canada Thistle, Cutleaf Teasel, Phragmites and Leafy Spurge to name a few.
