

Klingenberg introduced Governor Galusha. Since prior to the meeting Governor Galusha had encouraged members to bring a non Rotarian to the meeting, someone who has made a difference in the community, his first order of business was to recognize 2 such

guests. Ellie Connot (also our newest member), guest of Jason Smith and Emily Raef. guest of Jim Pattavina were introduced and spoke briefly about their community service.

Governor Galusha then took us on a journey to tell us about the impact of Rotary on his life. His first introduction to Rotary was when he was asked to be ambassadorial a n

tle England and ended up

with a degree in mal-adjusted children. The Omaha Northwest club then asked him to join so he became a member. He served on many committees and as club president but was still just a "member". When he was asked to serve as District Governor, he attended the Rotary International Convention for the first time. It was only then that he truly became a "Rotarian". The International Conference had a profound impact on him and he began to truly understand the concept of "service above self" as

he saw all the wonderful projects of Rotarians around the world and how they impacted people and communities.

The fight to eradicate polio is an

excellent example of the good that Rotary does. Rotary has exceeded the \$200 million required to receive the match from the Gates Foundation and as a result the Gates Foundation gave an additional \$50 million to the Polio cause. In addition the World Health Organi-

zation has agreed to give \$.50 for every additional \$ given to the cause. There are only 3 countries left to completely eradicate Polio; Pakistan, Afghanistan and Nigeria

> which is a phenomenal achievement.

Governor Galusha then briefly discussed some exciting changes coming to Rotary next year. "Future Vision" will change the way Rotary works for every-




