PRESIDENT'S CORNER



Greetings Rotarians! I wanted to use my first few President's addresses to talk about our club's goals for the coming year and how we hope to achieve them. Last week I talked about our first goal of attaining and maintaining 55 members. Our second goal for this Rotary year is to increase the number of female members and younger professionals. This goal is one that is particularly important to me as a young female professional myself. I remember when I first joined Rotary, I mentioned my new membership to a work colleague, and she asked, "Why would you join an old man's club?" I have never felt that Lincoln

South is an "old man's club" but I know that perception is out there for Rotary International. It wasn't until 1989 that Rotary International began admitting women to membership*. Today, Rotary has a little fewer than 188,000 female Rotarians worldwide, which I find shocking considering that there are a total of 1.2 million Rotarians worldwide*. Unfortunately, the male to female ratio in our club isn't much better. Also, the average age of Rotarians worldwide is 58*. I truly believe that if we want to continue to grow and thrive as an organization, we have to increase the number of female members and of younger professionals. Having a club that is well balanced in gender, age, ethnicity, and professional classification ensures we are able to continue to have the active, vibrant membership needed to best serve our community.


Notes & Announcements

Polio Fundraiser—Aaron Babcock has contributed Husker Illustrated yearbooks to be sold at \$10 apiece as a fundraiser for Polio with 100% of the proceeds benefitting the End Polio Now Campaign as well as other activities of Lincoln South Rotary.

End Polio Now Event—Nicki Klein reported Lincoln is very close to its goal for raising its portion of the \$200 million Challenge Grant to Rotary International from the Bill Gates. To raise the remainder of the funds, the Lincoln Rotary Clubs have scheduled a "Strike Out Polio" event at the Salt Dogs game on August 19th. Tickets for the club section behind home plate will be \$16 each with 1/2 of the proceeds going to polio eradication. The goal is to sell 243 tickets which is the capacity of the club section. There also will be opportunities to qualify to throw out the first pitch. See page 5 for Flyer with details.

Rotary 107 — In 2008 when Rotary was 104 years old, the District Governor challenged all members to be active by awarding points for participation. Anyone with 104 points or more by the end of March of that Rotary year was awarded with a special Rotary 104 lapel pin. The challenge is on again this year with Rotary 107. Anyone who reaches 107 points will be recognized by the District Governor. In fact he is planning a special recognition for those who get their points in early. Rita then spoke to the club about the Saguromo Children's Home Project where Lincoln South obtained a District Simplified Grant and partnered with the Tiblisi Academia Rotary club to buy computers and English Language instruction materials for the home. As part of the project they were also able to offer English Language classes to adults in the area.

They are holding another fundraising event to be able to continue to hold English Language and computer classes

and provide transportation to the students to get to the classes. They are holding an art exhibition and brought some of the art pieces with them to hold an exhibition in the US while they are here. They need \$1,000 to \$2,000 to complete the project.

There were 2 other members of their group

with them on Friday: Nino Tokhadze with the Foreign Languages learning Centre and Mariam Tkeshelashvili a student whose mother has previously visited the US. Students in the group range in age from 12-21 with most about 16-17 years old. They must go through a screening process, speak English and be able to get a VISA to be part of the group.
