



INTERNATIONAL AVENUE OF SERVICE

The International Avenue of Service report was given by John Herdman. Rotary Clubs serve communities around the world, to meet unique concerns and needs. Rotarians have adapted and improved the way it responds to those needs taking on a broad range of service projects. The areas that are included are peace and conflict prevention and resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy, and economic and community development.

John reported that several Lincoln South Rotarians have participated in international service. Nicki Klein has done a National Immunization Day in India and Nicaragua. Tom and Jenny Cardwell have made several trips to the Republic of Georgia to help with an orphanage and a startup mentoring program. Some Lincoln East Rotarians started a project in Zambia which became a District 5650 project.

Polio eradication is one of the main focus points of service. There are only three countries left with polio which are Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan. The United Nations, Rotary International and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation are in partnership to eradicate this disease in the remaining countries. India has reported no new polio cases in over a year.
