

PROGRAM

Pat Grewe, president elect of Lincoln South Rotary was our speaker for the day. Pat recently attended the Rotary

International convention in New Orleans since President Elise was not able to attend.

Pat told the club that the convention was totally different than he expected. Unlike most business conferences, the convention was more like the Worlds Fair of Rotary

with the objective of providing inspiration and entertainment to get members to go back to their local clubs and be active.

Pat traveled with a group from District 5650 who stayed in the French Quarter which was about a mile from the convention. Pat walked each day from the hotel to the convention, taking in sights of New Orleans along the way.

The convention consisted of plenary sessions which brought all participants together for the presentation of general topics

and breakout sessions which covered specific topics in more detail. Pat was particularly interested in a session on the Annual Programs Fund which included current balances and how the fund is invested.

Pat also showed a video of a choir from South

Africa which was brought to the convention by Simon Estes who is a member of the Des Moines club and sponsors the choir.

There are over 34,000 Rotary clubs in 200 countries around the world and the convention is a chance to make connections and truly see what a difference Rotary makes in the world.
