

Marianne Worthington was our

speaker. Marianne's company Work Warrior helps companies build fearless, strong and skilled teams. One of the first steps to that goal is to evaluate the health of the work place since an unhealthy workplace affects productivity and ability to achieve company goals.

Studies have shown that 70% of the work force is disengaged and 30% of those are actively disengaged which means they are actively working against company

goals and trying to sabotage the company. 37% of respondents say they work in a hostile work environment. The biggest cause of the hostile work environment are conflicts between employees. In fact 24% to 60% of most manager's time is spent on conflict resolution.

There are 3 over-arching causes of conflict which include 1.) Personality clashes, 2.) Company culture and 3.) Lack of skills to cope with conflict. As we all know if conflict is not resolved it festers and does not go away on its own. It is a major cause of mental difficulties such as depression and anxiety in em-



ployees and results in high turnover and low productivity. Since it costs 1.5 times

the salary of each employee lost to train a replacement, creating a positive company culture can be very powerful.

Marianne gave us the following tips for creating a positive company culture:

1. Stay focused on the essential objectives. Don't argue just to argue.

2. Don't fight over things that don't matter.

- 3. Build an empathetic understanding of other's points of view. Take the time to understand.
- 4. Keep your friends close and your enemies closer. The effort is worthwhile. Recognize your role in the conflict and attempt to forge an agreement for future interactions.
- 5. Change the dynamic. Record all meetings for documentation later.
- 6. Use humor to diffuse the situation.
