PROGRAM

Rotarian Jason Smith introduced the program. Dan Duncan is currently the Executive Director of the Nebraska Innovation

Campus Development Corporation. He served as the Operation Manager at the University of Nebraska Panhandle Research and Extension Center in Scottsbluff from 1987-1991. He was named Director of the University of Nebraska Agricultural Research and Development Center near Mead in 1991. He is a LEAD VII Fellow and has a Master of Science Degree in Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness.

His program centered on the Vision of the Innovation Campus. "It is a dynamic

environment where the university and private sector talent transform ideas into innovation that impacts the world."

As of January 5 there was an update to the strategic planning of Innovation Campus. They want to create a collaborative environment. It will be a twenty five year project.

The aspects of the campus will include: physical, intellectual, environmental and financial. The output will be a continuous transformation of ideas.

The themes of food, fuel and water provide the niche for the Nebraska economy. The campus will be a bridge between City and East Campus. The University will partner with private industry. One third of the campus will consist of UNL faculty and staff while two thirds will be private development.

The Master Plan will reveal an excellent road infrastructure, two historic buildings and two new buildings. It will be a robust infrastructure according to Mr. Duncan. The plan is to minimize the environmental carbon footprint with some innovative wa-

ter projects which will also reduce utility expense.

There will be development loops for carriers of technology like Windstream, Time Warner and Sprint. The 4H Building will become a conference center for 400 people and will be technologically advanced.

Mr. Duncan stated that the Campus will be a very social place. Phase I will include an outdoor plaza, and conference facility with all buildings connected. There will be 105,000 square feet of office space and 100,000

square feet of lab space. It will be designed so that people move. It will be a collaboration of artists, engineers and biologists. The former Industrial Arts Building will be rehabilitated.

There will be 280,000 square feet of mixed use space. The cost of Innovation Campus is expected to reach \$80 million. The state will fund \$25 million. Philanthropic organizations will fund \$15 million while the developers will fund \$40 million.

"Not just a place...A State of Mind." The business accelerator will be mentoring new businesses and extend virtually around the state.

Mr. Duncan is excited about the possibilities that Innovation Campus will create for the dynamic environment of business and research in our state.
