

Tom O'Connell, President and CEO of Snyder Industries was our speaker. Snyder Industries was found-

ed in 1957 by Larry Snyder in his garage. Now their headquarters which also includes one of their manufacturing plants at 48th and Fremont covers 1 city block. They have 8 manufacturing locations in 6 states and \$145 million in sales. They have 175 employees in Nebraska and a total of 550 employees across the United States. They really like Lincoln as they hire engineers from UNL and train them. Their

growth has occurred through both acquisition of strategic alliances and geographic expansion.

Many of the products that they make from plastic were initially made of steel or concrete. Their first product was plastic tanks used in agriculture. They make industrial chemical tanks with thicker walls to hold stronger chemicals.

Many of their chemical tanks are double walled to contain leaks. 10 years ago they introduced septic tanks to their product line. Their largest product line consists of intermediate bulk con-

tainers. They were designed 15 years ago to be small enough to be mobile and can be moved with a fork lift. They come in multiples of 55 gallons.

They also manufacture plastic material handling products under the Stratis brand name and the Bonar brand name as well as insulated containers & chests under the Polar brand. Other products include, flotation products; utilities, medical waste and refuse products; and some custom products for specific customers such as tool chests for pickups.

He explained the specialized rotational mold process that they use for larger hollow tanks which consists of filling a mold with powdered plastic and placing it in an oven at 600 degrees. As the plastic melts the mold is turned so the plastic coats the inside of the mold. When the plastic cools, it shrinks and can be easily taken out of the mold.
