

# PROGRAM

Our very own Tom Cardwell who is the District RYLA chair spoke to the club about RYLA ("Rotary Youth Leadership Awards"). Even though the RYLA program is geared to the 14-30 age groups, the decision was made to initially focus on high

school juniors since they are less distracted with high school senior activities and college applications.

Tom spoke about the RYLA camp that was held this year at Camp Catron. All the inbound Youth Exchange Students were also invited to come. There

were a number of plenary sessions such as "Colors Interpretation" from SCC, human rights discussion led by Dr. Tyler White, discussion of the importance of international travel & education, discussion of business ethics and lessons learned and discussion of human rights and peace led by Courtney Hilebrecht of UNL and Kathy Wolfe of Wesleyan.

There was a confidence course and obstacle course and other activities to build trust and team building skills, a culture walk to get acquainted and remove barriers, a challenge course with such challenges as the low wall, spider web and the wheel. The most significant activity was the RYLA challenge where the participants broke into small groups which were assigned to countries and tasked with selecting a humanitarian need, implementing a Rotary project to fill the need and writing a Rotary matching grant proposal. The chal-

> lenge took place through out the camp with teams working on parts of their proposal during any free time they had between activities.

> At the end of the camp, each team presented their proposals and the proposals were ranked. Each of the 37 participants received RYLA certificates for

their participation.


The camp for next year is scheduled for April 19th through the 21st at the Camp Catron Retreat Center. The timeline is as follows:
