Our own Short Heinrichs gave a presentation titled "Around the World in 40 years-Sojourn of a Happy Wanderer". which showed all the places where his career has taken him over the years.

During the course of his career, he has been to 70 countries on 6 continents. As a kid in Henderson Nebraska, he wanted to be a forester but he then developed an interest in International Agriculture.

His first trip was to India in 1972 as an entomologist through the University of Tennessee.

India was a land of great contrasts between wealth & Poverty. He worked in Brazil, the land of the carnival doing rice research. He traveled to Peru and then the Philippines for 10 years working for the International Rice Institute. He worked in China which is the land of rice where they have developed very advance rice hybrids. He worked in Africa, the land of color on a sorghum program through UNL.

He worked in Syria which is


very rocky and wheat, barley and lentils are the major crops. He traveled to Greece and Israel and spent 4 weeks in Europe and shared pictures of France, Monaco and Venice. He spent 6 months in Rome.

Since the UNL project that he was working on has ended, his next project is to work on an internation-

al program for Virginia Tech in Asia.

There are many factors which affect agriculture in other countries in addition to physical conditions, such as political climate, economy, education etc.
