

PROGRAM

Jason Smith introduced Scott Wieskamp, the Director of Facilities and Maintenance at the Lincoln Public Schools. He has been with LPS fourteen years. He graduated with a Bachelor and

Master degrees in architecture. He states that really love my job.' And he knows that everyday will be different. He acknowledges the great support that he gets from the Board of Education. Dr. Steve Joel, LPS Superintendent and his staff.

His program was titled Lincoln Public Schools: Past, Present, and Future. He believes that educating the kids is the most important thing that LPS does.

The 2012-2013 facility information is as follows:

64 facilities

7,000,000 square feet of buildings to manage

Lincoln's largest employer

Project Updates include:

Kloefkorn elementary in Southeast Lincoln is a brand new school with 70,000 square feet. It was an \$11.5 in project cost. It currently has 300 students. It utilized concrete precast elements which saves money and construction time.

Roper Elementary in Southwest Lincoln gained 45,000 square feet in additional space.

McPhee Elementary, which is near the State Capital, moved the students out to remodel. It was a total renovation which included geothermal heating and cooling. It is utilizing natural light which is impor-

tant for learning.

Hartley Elementary is at 33^{rd} and Vine. It has new windows and more energy efficiency. The footprint of the building changed and three portable classrooms went away.

Prior to the 2006 bond issue there were 107 portable classrooms. LPS is now down to 20. Portable class-

rooms are difficult to manage so the goal is to get rid of the portables. LPS is currently down to 20 portable classrooms.

The Donald Sherrill Education Center is for students, elementary through middle school with behavior problems. It was housed in a church at 56th and R. They have removed the church and are constructing a new building. It will be finished in 2013.

Belmont/Link is a building which will house Educare, an early childhood education program for preschoolers developed by the Susie Buffett Foundation. Other facilities with ongoing work include the LPS Primary Date Center, LPS Printer Center and Distribution, and the LPS District Office. There is no tax money being used to rebuild the LPS District Office. It is being built with insurance reimbursement from the fire and LPS sold off part of the land to private developers. The new District offices will feature LED lighting, and geothermal heating and cooling. This will increase the savings in energy dollars with a five year payback.

Mr. Wieskamp stated that in the past ten years, the cost of energy has doubled. The district has grown by 15-20% in that time. Energy efficient geothermal practices will result in a cost savings to LPS

MEMBERSHIP MINUTE- DICK MILLER

Dick was born in College View, Nebraska. It does not exist anymore as a town but is part of the Union College area. He often points out that the hospital he was born in is now a girl's dormitory for Union College. His careers were in the Air Force and in architecture. He said that "I worked to eat." He is currently retired. The most interesting place he has been was in Tehran in 1945 as he was leaving Russia. He stated that it was full of pink palaces and mud huts. The water system to the mud huts was very poor and unhygienic. He joined Rotary because a friend introduced him to the group.
