#### **PROGRAM**

Pe-Jim schong, Chief of the Lincoln Police Dept. was our speaker. Jim spoke with the club about the recent combination of the police, and fire department and 911 under a Public Safety Director with the goal of achieving certain efficiencies while offering the same services.



One of the main areas where this can take place is in the fleet service. Currently the police dept has 150 police cars and the fire department also has its own fleet of vehicles. Efficiencies can be gained by cutting duplicate management and facilities. Another area is the police service desk which handles non emergency calls. Those calls will be combined with the calls handled by the 911 service center and the police service center will just handle the in -person visits.

Chief Peschong also discussed some of the changes in the approach of the police department to wild party calls.

They have begun working with the landlords and talking to them about their responsibilities to the neighborhood to make sure their property doesviolate t h e "maintaining a disorderly household" ordinance. Issuing citations to the landlords instead of the

tenants has gotten results. In 2005 there were 1,883 wild party calls compared to 600-700 this year. Social media has also dramatically changed the dynamics of wild parties. A small get together can grow exponentially when the word gets out and become out of control in a short period of time.

Chief Peschong also talked about some of the information that can be found on the police department website such as: Crime mapping, Lists of arrest warrants, Lists of stolen items, Criminal histories, and Nebraska sex offenders to name a few. He also mentioned the Country Attorney data base with has free information which includes the State Patrol, Lancaster County Sheriff and Campus Police arrest records.
