Joe Roberts announced that November is designated as Rotary Foundation Month. The programs will reflect what educational programs are served and where the money goes for the Foundation.

He introduced Jarrod Widhalm. Jarrod served as an Ambassadorial Scholar to Monterey, Mexico. He is a 2009 graduate of Wesleyan University in Lincoln. He has been in an internship at Gallup and now is currently working there fulltime.

The purpose of the Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship is to further

world peace and understanding. The amount of \$24,000 went to cover the tuition expense at the Technological University of Monterey for Jarrod. It is an equivalent university to our Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Classes were held only in Spanish from four to six hours per day. Jarrod had four years of Spanish in high school and was a Spanish major at Wesleyan. He feels that his Spanish skills were improved by his experience in Monterey. He met other students from all over the world at school.

His studies were shortened due to drug gangs, corruption and violence in his neighborhood. Two students were killed while he was there. So the decision was made in March to have him come home and finish his studies online.



He stated that most Mexican students live at home while they attend college and that the Technological University of Monterey was very expensive. Dormitories are available for students. However, Jarrod shared an apartment with a student from Bolivia.

Jarrod studied international business and earned his master's degree. But this school's concentration of programs is in engineering and architecture. There are 25,000-30,000 students in

this university.

While he was at Wesleyan, he also studied in Nicaragua for a semester. He stated that was an excellent learning experience for him to improve his Spanish speaking skills.

Some requirements of the Ambassadorial Scholarship program include visiting Rotary Clubs, and volunteering to work with the local people and their businesses. Part of his volunteering included working with softball teams, basketball teams and flag football teams.

Jarrod will be sent to Sydney, Australia as part of his work assignment with Gallup and his experiences in international business.

A question and answer session followed the program.
