November is Rotary International Foundation month and in keeping with past years, all the November speakers will tell the club about the programs that the Foundation supports with contributions it receives. Then in December/January we will have our annual Foundation Drive to raise funds for the Foundation.

Joe Roberts, Rotary Foundation chair introduced Gretchen Bren as our speaker. Gretchen is the current District Polio Plus Chair.

Gretchen gave us a Polio + update with some good news. Nigeria has stopped the transmission of the wild virus and is expected to be polio free by next year and there are only 2 endemic countries left.

Gretchen then explained how National Immunization Day (NID) works. NID is a day set aside by the government of a country for immunization. The day usually includes polio immunizations but also may include other vaccines as well. It is done 6 to 10 times per year. She stressed the importance of the cold chain where the vaccine has to be kept cold to be viable. Thus cold carriers are key. Volunteers go out door to door with paid medical workers who do most of the work. They must keep track of every dose given. The process is hampered many times by political corruption and religious leaders in various countries. It is very helpful if you can get the local leaders to buy in to the process.

Why use Rotarians for this process? In many countries the Rotarians are a big draw since they are different. They get parents and kids out to see them who are curious about them. In fact the countries routinely use outside groups to bring out the crowds which helps the workers to get more done. It says thanks to the leaders and shows them we care about polio.

If they can get access to schools, they can get more accomplished in a day. The goal is to immunize every child under 5 yrs old. It can take 6 to 10 times for them to develop an immunity so they keep vaccinating them over and over.

Rotarians also look at local service projects while they are there and visit local Rotary meetings. One project distributes wheel chairs to polio survivors.

NID's benefit in many ways as reflected in the fact that Nigeria has been ebola free for 2 months primarily due to the medical infrastructure developed for polio.
