

PROGRAM

Joe Roberts introduced Robert Rapp who is the District Group Study Exchange chair as the speaker. Robert was part of a Group Study Exchange team to Venezuela in 1993. He has his Bachelor of

Science degree from Doane and his MBA from UNO. He grew up in south central Nebraska. He became interested in international efforts as he studied in Edinborough and Copenhagen. He was awarded an Ambassadorial Scholarship and studied in Scot-

land. He is currently a member of Omaha Morning Rotary Club.

He states that the Rotary Foundation offers "life changing opportunities." The Rotary Foundation started in 1917 with the purpose of doing good in the world. In 1928 the endowments exceeded \$5,000. The first grant was awarded in 1930 for the International Society for Crippled Children for \$500.

The Depression and World War II impacted growth of the fund. By 1947, contributions flourished. In 1965 and 1966 the Group Study Exchange Teams were organized along with technical training

and matching grants. By 1978 Rotary instituted Health, Hunger and Humanity programs. In 1984-85, Polio Plus was created to eradicate polio worldwide. In 1987-88, peace and conflict studies were insti-

tuted.

One billion dollars has been given to the Rotary Foundation. Paul Harris fellow contributions have totaled over one million dollars.

In 2010-11, there are \$795 million in assets. There have been \$208 million in contributions and \$191.8 million in expenses. There has been \$150.2 million

spent on programs, such as polio.

The future vision of the Rotary Foundation includes district and global goals. The following programs include:

Peace and conflict resolution
Disease prevention and treatment
Water and sanitation
Maternal and child health
Basic education and literacy
Economic and community development

The current Group Study Exchange team will be going to Brazil in May 2013 and learning Portuguese to present their programs. Elise Hepworth, of the Wayne Rotary Club, will be the GSE team leader. Team members have yet to be selected.
