

The Salvation army was formed in London England in 1865 by

William Boothe a Methodist minister who was very frustrated with the state of the church at that point in time. Kent shared that in those days only very pious people who literally bought seats in churches attended. He protested this arrangement as unchristian and was fired form his parish. He started the Salvation army in the poor neighborhoods in London. The organization first appeared in the United States in 1880 in New York. The Salvation Army came to Nebraska in 1888. It has been in Lincoln for over 50 years.

The organization offers many services to youth. Early afternoon (from 3-8 m -f) the Salvation army provides after school

> services to kids that includes a meal. Later in the evening older kids also frequent the center. Many come early to take advantage of the free meal. They are never turned away.

> The salvation army sponsors a heat share program which is

widely used. They also have a food pantry that is frequently accessed. Each summer the Salvation army offers a day camp that is used by over 300 low income children.

Approximately half of the agencies \$1,000,000 budget is fund raised and it includes bell ringing. Kent mentioned that this year contributions are down about \$20,000 probably reflecting the poor economy we are in nationally.
